
From the Director—

We have had the pleasure of having, two very intelligent, caring women to start volunteering with the Benevolence Program. These volunteers help with the administrative paperwork for our participants. With the assistance of these volunteers, Ellie Zimmer and Laura Nabozny, we have been successful in the following:

- Developing a database to collect more detailed data regarding the demographics of our participants to be used in grant applications
- Initiating an Outcome Survey to determine how our participants are faring financially six months from the time they met with the Benevolence Manager
- Executing a retention schedule for our participant files to remove older files securely and make room for new files

As our program continues to grow, our BRICK volunteers play a vital role in the behind-the-scenes administrative duties that sustain the Benevolence Program "to provide services and build relationships to change people's circumstances and lives through Christ."

When I began my journey

with The BRICK years ago working with the churches to get the Cable Area Food Shelf started, I did not imagine that I would eventually be the new Office Manager here in Ashland! It has always been a passion of mine to help those in need, since I myself grew up in poverty with very little food or money available. It is truly an honor to work with such an amazing staff and Board

Before I was hired on I went on my way, dealing with my own struggles in life - updating my Facebook status or rushing from work to get to the kids' game that night - not realizing so many in our area have no place to sleep and no food to feed their children. I was unaware that many of the people walking the streets of Ashland who wear backpacks are not students at Northland or WITC, but are homeless - sleeping in the woods or alley ways or at an acquaintance's home until they can find more permanent housing. Many are on disability or have had something happen recently that has left them disarrayed. Everything snowballs. There seems to be no end. It is always something. They get discouraged and come here in distress, not knowing where to turn or what to do. The BRICK is a safe place; a refuge in time of trouble; a ray of hope. We do whatever we can to help, whether it is to feed, clothe, shelter, or provide transportation. Sometimes just being a compassionate ear is all we can do, but it is what they need most at the time. We see such a great need every day that we are unable to fulfill all of the requests. I did not know there were so many people with their lives upside down in crisis.

I am truly amazed at the generosity of the people of Ashland and Bayfield Counties who give joyfully for these hurting people. Each and every day we receive donations of volunteer time, food, and money. I pray that what is given is blessed and multiplied because the God we serve is a mighty and awesome God, caring for all people, in all sorts of ways. The need is great, not only around the world, but here in our own community.

Please be aware. Open your eyes and hearts to the needy. See them as family needing a hand up, not a handout. That is "Our Vision: To provide services and build relationships to change people's circumstances and lives through Christ." He is our Living Hope! And He is working here at The BRICK Ministries in us and through us. Thank you for being a vital part of meeting the need. The community thanks you, and I also thank you.

I am excited to see what God does each and every day here at The BRICK and am grateful for the opportunity to serve Him here. If you are interested in helping out with your time please stop in and get a volunteer application. There is always something fun to do!
